New Mentoring Program in Fremont | John Roush

It is always a blessing to get to report a prayer answered. About 20 years ago YFC volunteers began ministering in the Sandusky County Juvenile Justice Center. Even that early in the JJC ministry's history, the volunteers prayed for some way to follow up on the relationships they had established with the teens while they were incarcerated. Traditionally, the teens would often leave with many returning to the life styles that caused them to be in the juvenile justice system. Earlier this year Herb Miller, a new volunteer at the Center, felt the Lord was calling him to do something about teens who leave the Center. With help from old time YFC volunteers and YFCUSA's Juvenile Justice Ministry staff and their resources, Herb developed a new mentoring program in Fremont. He has recruited five mentors and provided training for them earlier this year. Praise God that Herb has received the willing cooperation of the Juvenile Judge, the Center's head of operations, and the head probation officer. Please join us in praying for the Juvenile Justice Aftercare program in Fremont. Please pray that the Lord will help mentors sustain relationships made in the Center as they seek to raise up life-long followers of Christ.

I have never been able to figure out why we call overnighters...sleepovers or slumber parties?! We have had many overnight retreats for teens at GARAGE MINISTRY and sleep is not something that is ever too much a part of the event! Our recent retreat that we lovingly called "Blessings and Chaos" was no exception. We may not have had much sleep, but the night was full of blessings!

We loaded three vans on a recent Friday night with teens and headed first to Second Chance Village in Akron. It's a homeless community that is comprised of over thirty people living in tents right in the middle of town. This was our first stop on a twelve task scavenger hunt. The

teens had each prepared a scarf with a hand written note and an attached granola bar and their mission was to tie it to a nearby pole or structure so it could later be found and bring a smile and warmth to someone in need. The weather was cold and we'd been hit with a sudden snowfall. All the kids, and probably adults, were complaining about how they were "freezing"...that is, until we arrived at the tent community. Perspective set in. All of a sudden, we all real-



ized none of us really knew what COLD was. We had some conversations about how good it felt to bless others, how hard it must be to be outside living in the winter, and how we all have so many blessings that we take for granted.

After the "scarf bombing," each van headed out in separate directions to accomplish the other eleven tasks on the list. Lots of laughter and fun and strategic planning ensued, and a couple hours later we arrived at the lake house where we crashed for the night. The rest of the night included pinball, music from the record player, hanging out in the hammocks and lots of crazy shenanigans, as only teens can provide. The complaints about no Wi-Fi were short lived as they quickly just settled in to FUN.

One of the big blessings that came from the event was the impact that blessing others and sharing Christ's LOVE had on the teens. Several of the kids brought up other ways we could bless the tent community in the future and several more talked about other community service projects we could do. They ALL want to go back and we are already planning to visit soon and make a pancake breakfast for everyone there! It is a true gift to see teenagers excited about sharing the love of CHRIST!
