The encounter often catches me off guard, and I cannot hold it together when they ask the question. And that's ok. It's good for them to see how real it is. How real Love is. How real our God is. There is incredible, divine Power in moments like this, because we get to point to the Source of and Reason for our Love.

2020 was a year of transformation. That Place for Teens, our Brunswick teens center, saw a lot of physical transformations with the addition of a fully functioning kitchen, new lighting, ceiling tiles, newly painted walls, and a new activity area. All transformations that help in providing a safe and inviting environment to share the Gospel with teens who would never enter the doors of a church. But these were not the only transformations that happened. I am most excited to see the transformation that happened to the Brunswick ministry itself and how our adult leaders and volunteers stepped up to the challenging times of a global pandemic to continue to meet the needs of local teens and share the love of Christ with them.

In February and March, we were building steady attendance at the new after-school ministry. Located right across from the Middle School, God was sending us new teens every day. It was almost too easy. What an exciting time as we began to hear God say, "Yes, I have called you to minister to the teens of Brunswick" in a new way. And then Covid . . . I cannot tell you how many times I've said that phrase. As we navigate the pandemic, we have been tested. Everything we had started seemed to be challengedwas it safe to continue, was the need still there, had we understood God's call incorrectly? The pandemic has forced us, as leaders, to rethink what outreach can look like and forced us outside of the comfort zone to be better warriors for Christ, finding new ways to demonstrate His love and share the Gospel.

2020 brought about an increase of depression and suicide, which only highlights the need that people have for the love, hope, and comfort that only Christ can provide. We have been called to be His light; therefore, we have committed to staying open and available for those who need us. So, we transform to meet God's calling. We have modified staffing to minimize contact and allow for greater flexibility as needed. We are physically open one day a week for high school ministry and one day a week for middle school ministry and have added virtual connection opportunities. Students can join us on Monday's for a hybrid experience (in- person and on Zoom) and on Thursdays we are continuing to offer Life Hacks for High Schoolers via Zoom. We disinfect surfaces between every ministry, and stock hand sanitizer and masks. While Covid has prevented some teens from coming to us, our leaders continue to pray for them and stay in touch with notes and phone calls. We hope to resume daily in-person ministry soon, but that is in God's hands, so we stand by patiently.

While the world would have us fearful of a virus, as Christians we know that none of us is guaranteed tomorrow regardless of this virus. However, we also know that "all things work together for the good to them that love God, to them who are called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28) and that as believers in Christ we have a place prepared for us in heaven that is far better than the sinful world that we live in. That is why in 2021 we will continue to transform ministry at That Place for Teens to demonstrate Christ's love and share His hope with teens. Will you pray for God's encouragement for our teens and adult leaders this year and continue prayers for additional monthly donors to help this vital teen center stay open for the thousands of teens of the Brunswick community?

The Why Behind Our Mentors Part 2 | Laurie Beal

I have heard from many over the years that they have been thinking about maybe becoming a mentor at the Garage. There's usually excitement sprinkled with fear of the unknown as we talk. For those of you still on the fence, the following personal accounts give a glimpse of why we do what we do!

Why do you mentor?....

"First, I have to share the reason/purpose/power that is the Source of all true obedience. I simply get to walk with my Lord as I offer my life (time, talents, resources, etc) back to Him. He graciously invites us to join Him in His Work, in the desires of His heart, to experience Him. He truly transforms us and renews our minds as we walk with Him in the good deeds that He has prepared for us. Our God has such a desire to love and rescue those who are hurting and perishing. To be drawn into His love and His heart for others is to experience real Life.



There is one specific encounter/reaction that I have experienced dozens of times over the years as I have been blessed to get to enter the lives of young people, to develop relationships with them, and to point them to Christ. Kids are often guarded at first, and relationships can remain at the "surface level" for some time. However, as the relationship continues to develop, as the young person begins to sense that there is real concern/sacrifice/Love at the heart of our relationship, they often begin to soften. It is at this point, that some will actually become really serious (sometimes in tears) and ask me a question that demonstrates that God is working in their hearts; that they are willing to trust and be vulnera-
