"I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted"—Job 42:2 What a crazy and unpredictable calendar year! It has been a time where it will be recognized by most as historical, tragic, stressful, life altering...the list could go on. Through this time, however and not shockingly, I have seen in both my personal life and ministry many blessings. Why is this not shocking? God is in control.

In both our Wednesday and Thursday Club nights, we just finished our annual series on 'Who is God?' It is a focused look at the three persons of the Trinity as well as a very specific look on how our relationship with each of them plays out in the Gospel message. It is my goal to have every one of our kids be able to answer a series of questions with these answers:

What is our big problem? "We sin so we are separated from the Father."

What happens if you sin? "You deserve death, physically and spiritually."

What was the Father's plan to get us back? "He sent His Son to save us."

What didn't Jesus do? "Sin."

So what shouldn't have happened? "He shouldn't have died."

But what did happen? "He died."

I never thought that I would do a call and response with a bunch of teenagers and they would seem into it...I think they are just excited to know answers to the questions I'm asking! And if you're wondering, they don't get all of them word for word, but in general they are all shouting pretty much the same thing.

Beyond the message of the gospel, we spend each week looking into the names and characteristics of each of the persons of the Trinity and why those are so important. This brings us back to God being in control. One of the characteristics of God is that He is sovereign. It is because of this that in spite of the events of this year that we can rest easy. It is because of the many other verses that affirm to us not only is He in control, but works all things to His good, that we can see God moving in what appears to be chaos to us. While this year has certainly presented new challenges, we have seen great faithfulness from God in our ministry as weekly numbers are higher and more consistent then I've seen in the past. Not only are we getting to share God's Truth with more kids more often, but this group of kids is excited to be there and be hearing that Truth.
