The new programs are as follows:

CityLife: CityLife reaches teens "right where they are" with their hurts, habits, and hang-ups. They are a great community to get to know and share Jesus with.

Campus Life High School: Hosted at Fremont High School, this program gives teens a place to play crazy games, invite friends, and have a discussion on life skills with gospel presentation.

Campus Life Tiffin High School: CL Tiffin is a brand new offshoot of the YFC Core Tiffin kids that is offering a different time and more evangelistic message.

Juvenile Justice Ministry Aftercare: JJM AfterCare is geared to connect trained mentors with teens who are either in probation or in the JJM.

We are looking forward to what each of these programs has to offer in 2018 as these programs are enhanced and continue to grow. Thank you to all donors and volunteers of 2017. We could not have done it without you!
