The thunderstorm was fierce and the noise woke up a frightened 5-year-old Sara. She cried out for her mother who quickly arrived to comfort her. Her mother reminded her that she doesn't need to be scared, because Jesus is always with her. Sara responded, "I know that, but right now I need a Jesus with skin on!" Did you ever stop to see yourself as "Jesus with skin on"?

I visit the Juvenile Jail every week. Sadly, most every boy I meet comes from a broken home. Some tell of living with one parent, or grandparent. Many have never met their dad. It got me to wondering about my life. Over fifty years ago, my parents divorced. It was traumatic for me. Why didn't I end up in jail – or worse? I had a loving mom and four siblings. To this day, I don't know how mom did it. Divorce was not yet a common or an accepted event back in the early 60's. I certainly did enough stupid things to get in trouble. Mom told one of my brothers that she was relieved that none of her kids ever ended up in jail.

I think the non-spiritual answer to my question is that there was a social "safety net" in place. I had teachers that genuinely cared about me. I had friends whose parents treated me in such a way that I felt valued. There were neighbors who asked me how I was doing – and listened to my answer. Most of these people didn't know the impact their kindness or interest had on me. I'm not sure that I knew at the time. I certainly gave people many reasons to write me off.

I write this to encourage you to be aware of the power you have to favorably impact the youth God puts into your life. You don't have to be a certified youth leader, SS teacher or ministry leader. The kids I meet are open to what's real. They need to see Jesus with skin on. They may not respond as you would like. But they notice!

On our recent annual white-water rafting trip, I had the privilege of watching some superstars interact with teens, deal with drama, and share a life-changing message. Here are just a few stories of what I saw...

Several staff were spending time with young people and were talking about tough times the teens were facing at home. Divorce, drug use, adultery, were just a few of the things on the minds of teens. Our staff listened with compassion and sharing answers when applicable. It was a special time to see how the weight that these teens were carrying was lifted by finding a listening ear to share with.

The best part was stopping by each of the 4 small groups that were meeting each evening after the group program. Matt Mountjoy did a great job of getting teens ready for discussions as he shared at the program. The small groups created more opportunities for teens to open up and share about their lives and struggles. I was blessed to listen as adult leaders shared scripture and prayed for kids over the first two nights. The last night teens were given an opportunity to choose to follow Christ, and nine made that first time commitment, while others indicated they would like to talk more with a staff about following Jesus.

All of this was followed by a final presentation of The Gospel. While I'm not sure that we discovered any future Tony or Oscar Award winners, I am confident that the students learned more about Jesus' character. It also put them in a situation where they weren't just hearing scripture, but actively engaging

Now, she sees herself in a completely different way and it's like a weight was lifted. She was pleasantly baffled at the simpleness of it.

A young man shared that the lesson on fear really made him think and realize that he needs to start giving some stuff to God instead of carrying it around all by himself.

One teen was pretty frank, "I'm thinking so many things right now. Its kinda heavy. I can't really answer right now."

Many other teens shared that they were so thankful for the experience, and that they feel much closer to God, and realized that they need to start seeking God on purpose! Good stuff!

What a blessing to be part of this life-changing trip for these teens.
